1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing
- 1.2 The Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations Part 1 shall apply
- 1.3 Class Rules shall apply
- 1.4 For protests where only a Rule of Part 2, or Rule 31 is alleged to have been broken an arbitration hearing will be offered prior to any formal hearing.

2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official noticeboard in the Hyundai Marine Sports Centre, and on the web page, www.rayc.co.nz/mclass

3. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 1000 hours on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 1800 hours on the day before it will take effect.

4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the RAYC flagpole
- 4.2 When flag "AP" is displayed ashore, "1 minute" is replaced with "not less than 30 minutes" in the race signal AP

5. SCHEDULE

1200 hrs - Briefing

1325 hrs – Warning Signal

ASAP after Racing – Prize Giving

6. CLASS FLAGS

The class flag will be the M-Class class flag

7. RACING AREA

The racing area is on the waters of the Auckland Harbour between Mechanics Bay, Rough Rock to St Heliers Beach.

8. COURSES

The course will be a harbour course decided at the briefing.

9. MARKS

9.1 Fairway Marks” Yachts shall not pass between the shore and Tamaki beacon, Torpedo Bay Marker, permanently moored boats and the wave-break, or between Bean Rock reef black mark and Bean Rock

10. THE START

10.1 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an Orange flag on the starting mark at the starboard end and the port-end starting mark.

10.2 The Race Committee Vessel(s) may hold station by using engines. Any effects(s) shall not be grounds for granting redress. This alters RRS 62.1 b and 62.2

11. THE FINISH

The finishing line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the finish boat and the finishing mark.

12. PENALTY SYSTEM

For all classes rule 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

13. TIME LIMIT & TARGET TIMES

13.1 The time limit is three and a half hours.

13.2 Boats failing to finish 30 minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes will be scored a Did Not Finish. This changes rules 35 and A4 and A5.

14. PROTESTS & REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 14.1 Protest forms are available at the race office located in the RAYC/HMSC office. Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be delivered there within the appropriate time limit.
- 14.2 The protest time limit is 90 minutes after the last boat has finished the last race of the day.
- 14.3 Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held in the RAYC/HMSC clubhouse beginning at the time posted.
- 14.4 Notices or protests by the race committee will be posted to inform boats under rule 61.1(b).
- 14.5 Breaches of instructions 13.1, 17, 18 will not be grounds for protest by a boat. This changes rule 60.1(a). Penalties for these breaches may be less than disqualification if the protest committee so decided. The scoring abbreviation for a discretionary penalty imposed under this instruction will be DPI.
- 14.6 On the last scheduled day of racing a request for reopening a hearing shall be delivered
 - (a) within the protest time limit if the requesting party was informed of the decision on the previous day;
 - (b) no later than 30 minutes after the requesting party was informed of the decision on that day. This changes rule 66.
- 14.7 On the last scheduled day of racing a request for redress based on a protest committee decision shall be delivered no later than 30 minutes after the decision was posted. This changes rule 62.2.

15. SCORING

All helmspersons who sail in the "83rd Arch Logan Memorial" race shall have established a handicap of at least three races in that same season or shall be allocated a handicap equal to the "scratch" boat. Exceptional circumstances can be considered by the Racing Committee.

16. SAFETY

- 16.1 Each boat shall "sign on" and "sign off" for each day's racing on a sheet to be found on a table beside the official notice board at RAYC/HMSC.
- 16.2 A boat that retires from a race or returns to the launching area before she has finished the last race of the day shall notify the race committee as soon as possible.

17. EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with class rules and sailing instructions. On the water a boat can be instructed by a race committee equipment inspector or measurer to proceed immediately to a designated area for inspection.

18. RADIO COMMUNICATION

- 18.1 Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones
- 18.2 The Race Channel will be VHF 17 unless the Race Officer advises otherwise.

19. PRIZES

- 19.1 Prize giving will be held at Royal Akarana Yacht Club (HMSC) ASAP after racing.
- 19.2 The Arch Logan Memorial Trophy and all relative trophies will be awarded to the winners on the day and provisional results are subject to protest hearings.

20. DISCLAIMER OF ENTRY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

21. RIGHTS TO USE NAME & LIKENESS

By participating in the event, a competitor automatically grants to the Organizing Authority and the sponsors of the event, the right in perpetuity, to make, use and show, from time to time and at the discretion, any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or film television and other reproductions of him/her during the period of the competition for said event in which the competitor participated and in all material related to the said event without compensation.

22. USE OF DRONE FOR MEDIA

All those who take part in the regatta as competitors as well as support crew or spectators agree to be overflowed by a drone during the duration of the event, this includes your person and your property (boats).

Finish: All in the vicinity of Orakei Yellow Buoy

Start S to N rounding North Leading Buoy (stbd), Bastion (stbd), Orakei Yellow Buoy (stbd), North Leading Buoy (stbd), Orakei Yellow Buoy (stbd), North Leading Buoy (stbd), Bastion (stbd), Orakei Yellow Buoy (stbd), North Head Buoy (stbd) to Finish

Approx. 11.5nm

COURSE 3

Southerly Wind - Start Rough Rock vicinity

Start N to S rounding Orakei Yellow Buoy (port), Bean Rock (port), Rough Rock (port), Orakei Yellow Buoy (port), Rough Rock (port), Orakei Yellow Buoy (port), Bean Rock (port), Rough Rock (port) to Finish.

COURSE 5

Easterly Wind – Start Orakei Yellow Buoy

Start W to E rounding Bastion (port), Torpedo Buoy (port), Resolution(port), Bastion (port), Resolution(port), Bastion (port), Torpedo Buoy (port), Resolution (port), Bastion (port) to Finish.

Approx. 10nm

COURSE 6

Westerly Wind – Start Orakei Yellow Buoy

Start E to W rounding Resolution (stbd), Torpedo Buoy (stbd), Bastion (stbd), Resolution (stbd), Bastion (stbd), Resolution(stbd), Torpedo Buoy (stbd), Bastion (stbd), Resolution (stbd) to Finish.

COURSE 7

South-East Wind - Start Rough Rock vicinity

Start N to S rounding Bean Rock Buoy (stbd), Orakei Yellow Buoy (stbd), Rough Rock (stbd), Bean Rock Buoy (stbd), Rough Rock (stbd), Bean Rock Buoy (stbd), Orakei Yellow Buoy (stbd), Rough Rock (stbd), Bean Rock Buoy (stbd) to Finish.
